Register for BQC in IBIS</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Every school now has a Relationship Manager included in your membership dues • Evaluations are still submitted through IBdocs – No word on when it will be migrated to MySchool • Authorization documents are submitted through MySchool <p>PRC- Program Resource Center is the new OCC. Teacher resources Programme Communities- replaces the forums on the OCC BQC- Building Quality Curriculum- Is REQUIRED two years before your re-evaluation Two units per subject group and two interdisciplinary units must be a variety of subject levels. Submitted through Google Drive. BQC information sheet uploaded to coordinator Google Drive Personal Project Moderation mandatory annually. Register annually by Oct 20 in IBIS. Fee inclusive in annual fee, unless you miss the Oct 20 deadline.</p>	
<p>BQC Common Recommendations</p>	<p>Teachers submit units and then use the feedback to answer their Self-Study evaluation of the C standards, which is completed by each subject group on campus.</p> <p>Teachers must use the feedback from the submitted unit plans and show that they acted on feedback in their subject group.</p> <p>Ways to improve unit planning:</p> <p>Statement of inquiry must include</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One key concept • 2 to 3 related concepts • global context exploration • NO CONTENT • <p>Inquiry Questions should include</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A key concept, related concept(s) and exploration included in each inquiry question • These questions help students to deconstruct the statement of inquiry. <p>Assessments- GRASPS for the performance based assessment- not a requirement a best practice</p> <p>Content- Knowledge: state standards is fine do not just put the number, Discipline Skills, Attitudes (affective skills from ATL)</p> <p>Flipped unit planners- Action Section More details, not just a listing of teaching strategies Talk about how the ATL skills will be taught and inquiry questions</p> <p>Resources- Be specific, include the community</p> <p>Reflection- All 3 sections responding to questions from Principles to Practice</p>
